Course of Fire

Sighters

Unlimited sighters before the first competition shot.

Competition series – 60 shot (Men and Junior Men)

1 hour and 45 minutes, including sighters.

Competition series – 40 shot (Women and Junior Women)

1 hour and 15 minutes, including sighters.

Check the range is clear of personnel

"PREPARATION TIME BEGINS NOW"

- Start stopwatch
- (for competition) check:

- Shooters in the correct bays,
- Pistols and other equipment approved
- Shooters wearing Start Numbers if provided

Clear all pistols for casing and removal

Complete Range Report, and forward to Classification Office



- Sighting shots may only be fired before the first competition shot
- (for competition) Shooters must 'hand in' the competition targets each 10 shots
- (for competition) Shooters must leave their pistols at the firing line until the completion of the relay.
- In all cases, the Range Officer must clear the pistol before it may be removed from the firing line.
- The changing of gas cylinders may not be done at the firing line. Any pistol that is to be removed from the firing line must be cleared by the Range Officer

(for competition) Announce the bay

numbers for the trigger check

- After the shooter's first competition target is at the target line, any dry-firing that releases propellant will be counted as a scoring shot
- Targets are scored in the Classification Office
