GETTING STARTED

We encourage prospective members to contact us to organise a Wednesday night to try shooting and meet some Club members.

A Notice of Receiving Instructions (NORI) has to be filled out for each try at shooting. After 10 NORI's for adults and 3 NORI's for Juniors are filled out, under Victorian Legislation you must become a member of a Pistol Club and apply for your handgun license to continue pistol shooting.
